

2021 Community Impact Snapshot

I Support the Girls

- 979 new & gently used bras were distributed
- 29,568 menstrual hygiene products were distributed
- 642 pairs of new underwear were distributed
- 4,812 hygiene items were distributed

Nutrition

- 46,759 meals were provided to individuals
- 2,428 households assisted through food pantries
- 218 lbs. of food grown in the campus garden

Medical & Mental Health Services

- 1,792 health screenings
- 496 dental visits
- 981 visits for mental health and therapy services
- 89 individuals were provided services through Assertive Community Treatment



Boys & Girls Club served over 15,000 meals and provided Thanksgiving dinner and Christmas gifts for over 100 families.



The Salvation Army had a space for street homeless providing a food shelf, water and a place to get out of the weather.

Youth Services

- 850 students received school supplies during the Back to School Extravaganza
- 45 campus youth attended Boys & Girls Club through scholarships

Community Outreach

- 56 gas cards & bus passes were distributed
- 111 households received rental or utility assistance
- 34 fans were distributed
- 384 individuals received Holiday assistance
- 10 Ways to Work loans were completed

Volunteers

- 1,356 volunteers served 14,915 hours on campus, saving the campus \$425,674.10 (\$28.54 an hour).



MICAH House served 371 children, 173 families, and 200 single women.



Heartland Family Service helped 297 of 317 (94%) individuals exit to permanent housing, they were diverted from homelessness by being housed or maintaining housing

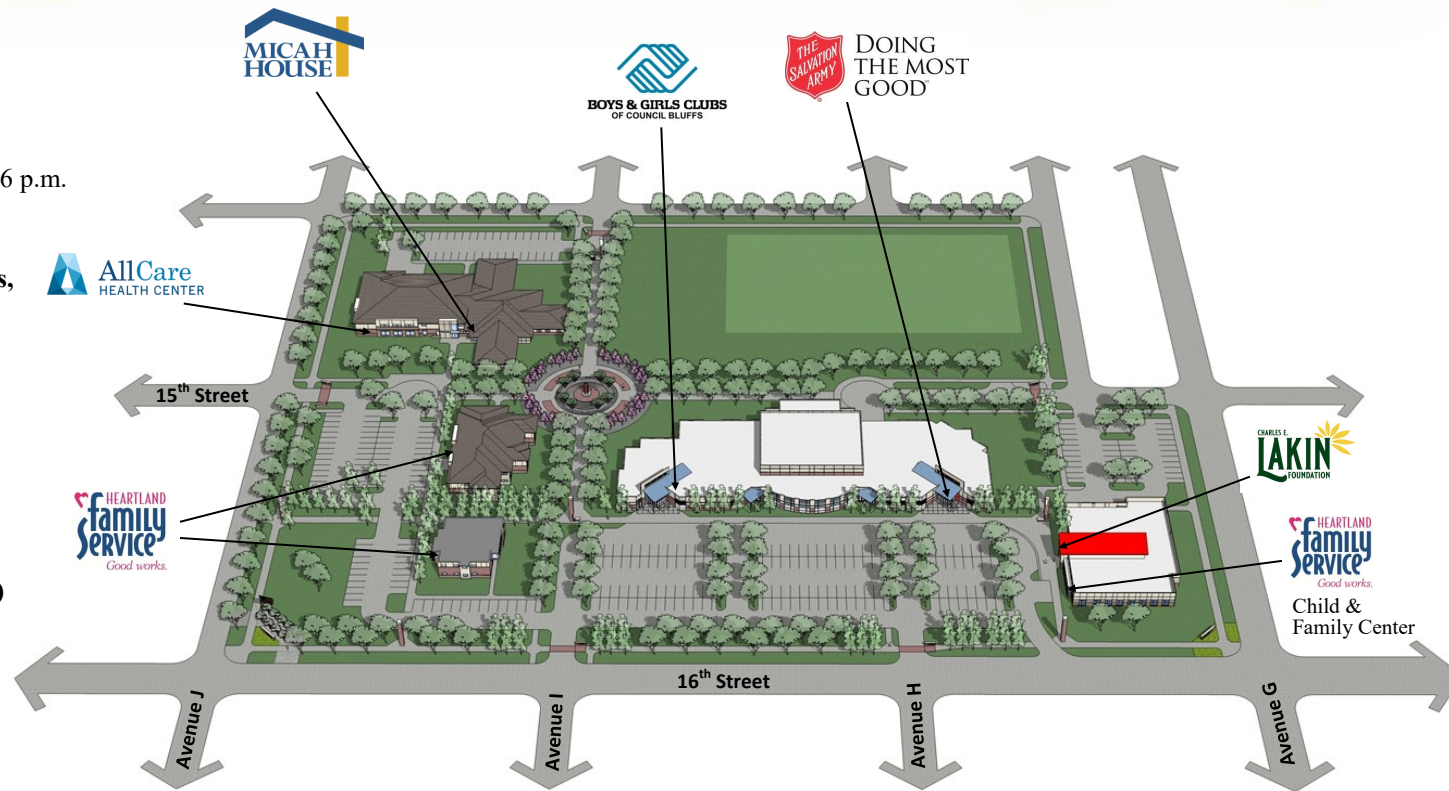
